- 1. Answer any one of the following questions:
  - (a) Discuss the theme of oppression and injustice in Shelley's poem, Song to the Men of England.
  - (b) In Telephone Conversation, Wole Soyinka successfully portrays the character of the African man as a victim of discrimination and racism. Comment.
  - (c) Identify and explain two major themes present in *I Can't Help Blossoming* by Dr. Ayyappa Paniker.

- 2. Write a critical appreciation of any one of the following poems:
  - (a) House of a Thousand Doors by Meena Alexander
  - (b) Journey to the Interior by Margaret Atwood
  - (c) The Gift Outright by Robert Frost
- **3.** Answer any *two* of the following questions:  $15 \times 2 = 30$ 
  - (a) Analyze how Forster contrasts love and tolerance in his essay, *Tolerance*.
  - (b) Evaluate Virginia Woolf's vision for modern writers and her emphasis on the idea of inclusion of women's experiences in literature in *Modern Fiction*.
  - (c) Malcolm X relates personal experiences in illustrating broader themes of racism and identity in *Nightmare*. Discuss.
- 4. Answer any one of the following questions: 15
  - (a) Discuss the central message and the theme of hypochondria in Jerome
     K. Jerome's A Man Who Was a Hospital.
     Analyze the author's use of humour.

- (b) How do the themes of social status and miscommunication impact relationships in the plot of A Marriage Proposal? Evaluate the development of the character of Lomov in the play.
- (c) Rabindranath Tagore offers a significant critique of traditional educational systems in *The Exercise Book*. Elaborately present your perception of this statement by referring to the value of education in personal and social growth expressed in the story.
- **5.** Answer the following questions:  $5\times3=15$ 
  - (a) Evaluate how The Man Who Was a Hospital serves as a satire on human tendencies to self-diagnose and exaggerate minor ailments.

Or

Narrate how Jerome's visit to the British Museum changes his perception on health.

(b) Compare the characters of Natalya Stepanovna and Ivan Lomov in A Marriage Proposal in the light of the theme of class differences.

Or

Examine the theme of materialism in the play, A Marriage Proposal.

(c) Rabindranath Tagore uses Uma's story to critique the hypocrisy of a maledominated society. Comment.

Or

Analyze the role of Uma's exercise book as a symbol of freedom and self-expression in the context of the patriarchal society in *The Exercise Book*.
