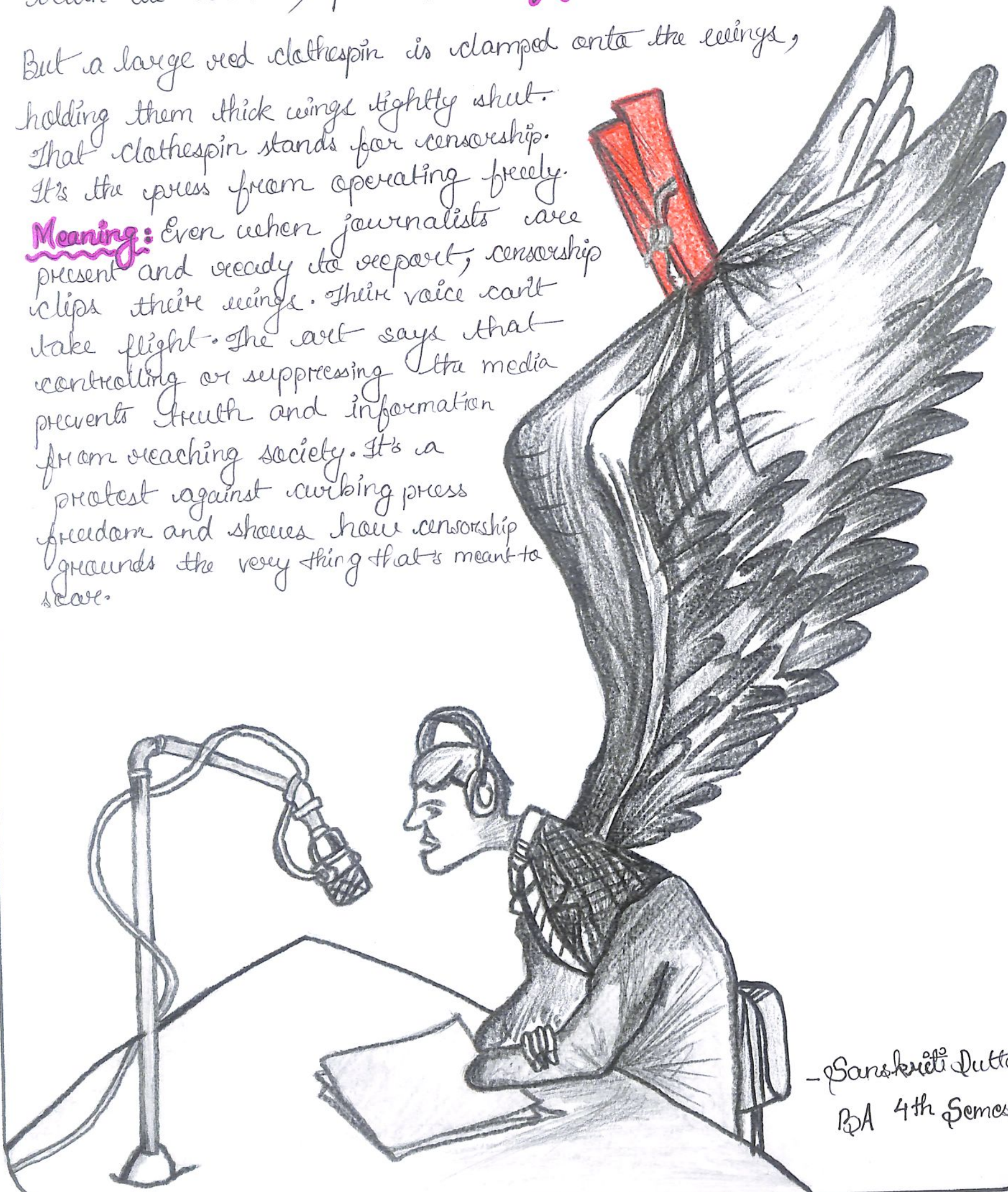

This sketch shows a journalist or radio broadcaster at a desk with a microphone and headphones. Instead of a normal head and body, he has huge wings growing from his back. Wings represent 'freedom of speech', the ability for news and truth to travel, spread, and "fly" to the public.

But a large red clothespin is clamped onto the wings, holding them thick wings tightly shut. That clothespin stands for censorship. It's the press from operating freely.

Meaning: Even when journalists are present and ready to report, censorship clips their wings. Their voice can't take flight. The art says that controlling or suppressing the media prevents truth and information from reaching society. It's a protest against curbing press freedom and shows how censorship grounds the very thing that's meant to soar.
